**A. PROCLAMATION NO. 1-2008 - ARC AWARENESS MONTH**

**WHEREAS**, intellectual and developmental disabilities are conditions which affect more than 7 million Americans and their families AND;

**WHEREAS**, public awareness and education enhance a community's understanding of the issues affecting people with intellectual and developmental disabilities AND;

**WHEREAS**, people with intellectual and developmental disabilities can be vital and vibrant members of our communities, improving the quality of life for all of us AND;

**WHEREAS**, the month of March has been designated Arc Awareness Month by the state of New Jersey with 20 chapters of The Arc undertaking public awareness, educational and fundraising initiatives AND;

**WHEREAS**, The Arc of Monmouth serves over 1400 individuals with cognitive disabilities throughout Monmouth County and advocates for and with people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families AND;

**WHEREAS**, The Arc of Monmouth is celebrating 59 years of service to families and individuals throughout Monmouth County and;

**THEREFORE**, Honorable Maria D. Fernandes, Mayor of Sea Bright does hereby Proclaim March, 2008 as ARC AWARENESS MONTH In the Borough of Sea Bright, New Jersey and urges that the citizens of Sea bright, New Jersey give full support of efforts towards enabling people with intellectual and developmental disabilities to live full and productive lives of inclusion in our communities. **ORDINANCE NO. 2-2008**

**ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT TO PROVIDE LEGAL COUNSEL AND INDEMNIFY OFFICIALS, EMPLOYEES AND APPOINTEES OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT IN CERTIAN ACTIONS BROUGHT AGAINST THOSE OFFICIALS, EMPLOYEES AND APPOINTEES.**

**WHEREAS**, Title 59 permits local units to adopt Ordinances defending and indemnifying its officials, employees and appointees in lawsuits; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Sea Bright Governing Body has deemed and determined that it is important that it adopt an Ordinance to defend and indemnify its officials, employees and appointees in certain lawsuits in the interests of fairness and justice, and to promote participation by its officials, employees and the general public as appointees in the government process.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Sea Bright that:

**Section 1:** Except as hereinafter provided, the Borough of Sea Bright shall, upon the request of any present or former official, employee or appointee of the Borough of Sea Bright provide indemnification and legal defense for any civil action brought against said person or persons arising from an act or omission falling within the scope of their public duties, or filed against them as an official, employee or appointee of the Borough of Sea Bright.

**Section 2:** The Borough of Sea Bright shall not indemnify any person against the payment of punitive damages, penalties or fines unless the Governing Body, in their opinion, conclude that the acts committed upon which the punitive or exemplary damages are based do not constitute actual fraud, actual malice, willful misconduct or an intentional wrong. In any case asserted, whether it is for punitive damages or penalties or not, the Borough of Sea Bright shall provide for the legal defense of such claims in accordance with the standard set forth hereinafter. The Borough of Sea Bright recognizes that the duty

to defend its officials, employees and appointees is greater than its duty to indemnify in certain circumstances. Even so, the Borough of Sea Bright may refuse to provide for the defense and indemnification of any civil action referred to herein if the Governing Body of the Borough of Sea Bright determines that:

(a) The act or omission did not occur within the scope of a duty authorized or imposed by law;

(b) The act or failure to act was the result of actual fraud, willful misconduct or actual malice of the person requesting the defense and indemnification; or

(c) The defense of the action or proceeding by the Borough of Sea Bright would create a conflict of interest between the Borough of Sea Bright and the person or persons involved.

**Section 3:** The terms of this Ordinance and the definition of official, employee and appointee are to be construed liberally in order to effectuate the purposes of this ordinance. However, these terms shall not mean:

(a) any person who is not a natural person,

(b) any person while providing goods or services of any kind with any contract with the Borough of Sea Bright except an employment contract or professional services contract,

(c) any person while providing legal or engineering services for compensation when the claim is made by the Borough of Sea Bright against the professional providing those services,

(d) any person who has a condition of his or her appointment or contract that they are required to indemnify and defend the Borough of Sea Bright and to secure appropriate insurance.

**Section 4:** The Borough of Sea Bright shall provide for the defense and indemnification of any present or former official, employee or appointee of the Borough of Sea Bright who becomes a defendant in a civil action if the person or persons involved:

(a) acted or failed to act in a matter in which the Borough of Sea Bright has or had an interest,

(b) acted or failed to act in the discharge of a duty imposed or authorized by law, and

(c) acted or failed to take action in good faith.

For purposes of this Ordinance, the duty and authority of the Borough of Sea Bright to defend and indemnify shall extend to a cross-claim or counter-claim against said person.

**Section 5:** In any action or proceeding, including criminal proceedings, the Borough of Sea Bright may provide for the defense of a present or former official, employee or appointee, if the Borough of Sea Bright includes that such representation is in the best interest of the Borough of Sea Bright and that

the person to be defended acted or failed to act in accord with the standards set forth in this Ordinance.

**Section 6:** Whenever the Borough of Sea Bright provides for the defense of any action set forth herein, and as a condition of such defense, the Borough of Sea Bright may assume exclusive control over the representation of such person defended and such person shall cooperate fully with the Borough of Sea Bright.

**Section 7:** The Borough of Sea Bright may provide for the defense pursuant to this Ordinance by authorizing its attorney to act on behalf of the person being defended or by employing other counsel for this purpose or by asserting the right of the Borough of Sea Bright under any appropriate insurance policy that requires the insurer to provide a defense.

**Section 8:** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication as required by law.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** that this Ordinance shall take effect upon its adoption, passage and publication according to law and moved the Public Hearing to be held. Second by Councilwoman Long and approved by the following vote:

The Two Rivers Mayors Council met on March 1 and Bill Dressel, Executive Director, NJLM was the guest speaker. He urged the Mayors and their Finance Officers to attend a March 6 meeting in Trenton. She and Auditor Richard Hellenbrecht will attend.

The Fort Monmouth Suneagles Golf Course may soon open to the general public. Colonel Stephen Christian has received endorsement from local leaders. If he receives permission from the Department of the Army, a decision may be possible prior to May for the 2008 golf season.

The Two Rivers Mayors agreed to a resolution urging the NJ Council on Affordable Housing to adopt regulations that create realistic affordable housing goals that give municipalities the tools to reach these goals within the bonds of sound planning and without overburdening the taxpayers.

The Two Rivers Mayors have also agreed to send a letter to Governor Corzine urging him to have Monmouth Park Racetrack implement new management procedures to contain the waste now, before the 2008 racing season begins.

At the Two Rivers Mayor Council Meeting there were two guest speakers from CASA, Court Appointed Special Advocates, a

volunteer group which handles children's cases and works with DYFS. If anyone is interested, I will leave the information packets in the front office.

Shore Regional's budget meeting for Mayors and Municipal representatives is scheduled for Wednesday, March 12, 6 PM, at the high school.

Mayor Fernandes said that she is scheduled to be on Comcast Newsmakers between March 12, and the 18<sup>th</sup> on Channel 30 at 54 minutes past the hour to speak on beachfront enhancements.
